# From our Pastor - Pr. Devlyn Brooks

Sunday, Sept. 24, 2023, should go down in the history of Faith Lutheran Church as one of those milestone moments that members look back on years from now and say, "Wow, what a special day for our church that was!"

I hope that you feel the same.

For those who were unable to join us, first in the morning at worship, we had a 90-minute service, of which most of the time was filled with Faith members sharing what is on their hearts about what our church means to them, and also their thoughts about our future.

That conversation still gives me chills more than 24 hours later! ... And it definitely will go down as one of the most memorable communions I have had the good fortune of presiding over, most certainly! The feeling in the church after that conversation was pure Christ-like love!

And then in the evening, our church played host to about 50 people from all over our synod's Conference 5. Pastors and lay leaders -- from churches big and small, close and far away in our conference -- came to join us for food, fun and fellowship during this conference's stop on the synod team's annual "Road Trip."

Each year, the synod staff hosts one "Road Trip" stop per conference all around our synod. And we were chosen some months ago to host our conference's stop this year. During Sunday's event, we hosted a picnic style dinner for all, Bishop Bill Tesch led us in a Bible study on the stewardship of time, and then the synod staff provided a short presentation about the state of the synod and the many programs and initiatives underway throughout the synod.

After spending about 10 hours at our church on Sunday, I left a little overwhelmed from all of the emotional energy that was poured out. But on the drive home, I realized it was a good kind of tired. The kind of tired after an amazing day that you want to capture in your memories forever!

Sunday was the kind of day in which our church was busy from morning until night, and what a better testimony to the importance of the conversation that took place among our Faith family that morning!

So now what?

I can imagine some of you thinking, "Sure pastor, Sunday was a good day, a productive day. A day to celebrate that so many from around our conference came to see our beautiful church. And the morning conversation during worship was a good start to discussing what our future is. ... But now what?"

Right? It's a natural question.

Well, I don't think I have to tell anybody that Sunday's congregational conversation was only a start. From here, it's going to take hard work and commitment to figure out what Faith Lutheran's next chapter is.

I would say that in the immediate future three things need to happen:

• First, as members who love this church, you all need to keep this conversation going. Sunday wasn't a deciding point; it was a discerning point. And that discernment will continue. So, please keep talking about this topic -- what is our future? -- with your fellow members, and also with your current church council. As leaders of the church, it is imperative that you continue to keep them informed about your thoughts, wishes, dreams and even fears. While the council is elected to represent the Faith body at large, they also depend on you for vital feedback.

- Second, the council and I will revisit Sunday morning's conversation at the October council meeting and discuss next steps. Again, I don't think any next steps are abundantly clear, but I do believe the council at least has some of your feedback to add to the continuing conversation. And that will be very helpful.
- Third, pray. We are a people who believe in the power of prayer. I think it's imperative that we continue to invite God into this conversation with us, and ask God what our future should hold. I ask that you pray for the council as they begin this work, and I ask that you pray that I continue to lead in faithful ways. Prayer is everyone's job, and a very important one!

In my best judgment, that is what I believe happens next for our church. And then after we've discussed this vital topic again at the next council meeting, I pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to lead our church down the path of discernment.

Faith Family ... please remember that we did holy work on Sunday morning. That wasn't just talk. That was a dedicated and loving Faith Family coming together to express intimate thoughts. That's not easy work, I am so proud of our church for this!

And I want to hold up that it is true that we are still in an envious position to many churches. So, let's remember this is a time to live out of joy and hope and not out of fear. Let's trust that God will help us transition to the next chapter, whatever it is!
